<u>Ida Applebroog: Monalisa</u> October 14, 2021–January 16, 2022

As part of *Toward Common Cause*, the Neubauer Collegium's gallery features an installation of *Monalisa* by <u>Ida Applebroog</u>. Living in Southern California in 1969, Applebroog sought refuge from her life as a single mother in her bathtub, where she spent between 2 and 3 hours an evening drawing pictures of her body. This ritual eventually resulted in 160 portraits of Applebroog's vagina. Packed away in 1974 and rediscovered in 2009, the drawings are installed as wallpaper on a wooden structure resembling a house.
